

## Word Reading and books

Children will be introduced to RWI reading books when they successfully begin to read words in captions and short sentences.

Please see list below of the progression of book colours and speed sounds.

During the RWI sessions, children will read the same book three times. Each time, the session will follow a different focus *e.g. expression and pace, vocabulary and comprehension*. These sessions ensure that children have plenty of opportunities to practise using their developing reading skills, whilst becoming more familiar with the text.

## Word time

Within all the books children will have **red** and **green** words to learn to help them to become speedy readers. **Red** words are words that are not easily decodable and there are also words to extend children's vocabulary. **Green** words contain the sounds that children have been learning and are easily decodable.

Dots and dashes or 'sound buttons' represent the sound each letter makes.





As the children progress and become more confident with reading red and green words, the dots and dashes are taken away and children are encouraged to read speedily, without having to segment (Fred talk). This helps build childrens' fluency and pace.

## Nonsense words (Alien words)







As well as learning to read and blend real words, children will have plenty of opportunities to apply their sound recognition skills to read 'nonsense words' or 'alien words'. These words will also feature heavily in the Year One Phonics Screening check in June, Summer term.
